STATE COLLEGE, PA – On Monday, August 17, The Penn State Interfraternity Council (IFC) became aware of the serious criminal allegations announced by the Pennsylvania Attorney General involving former fraternity members at Penn State.

These allegations are deeply concerning and in direct opposition to the principles and values of the IFC. The IFC strives to create a safe and welcoming environment for all students. As we continue to review publicly available information, we are also actively evaluating our own policies, expectations, and practices, to identify opportunities to strengthen accountability, education, and harm reduction across our community. We recognize the seriousness of these allegations, and we extend our concerns and support to anyone who may have been impacted.

We are committed to working alongside Penn State, the Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life, national fraternity organizations, and other stakeholders to promote safety and responsible leadership.

The safety and wellbeing of our members and the broader Penn State community remain our highest priorities. Our focus moving forward is on supporting the University's investigation, learning from any additional information that emerges, and continuing to strengthen the fraternity experience for current and future Penn State students.

We encourage all members of the Penn State community to promptly report any concerning behavior or safety concerns to law enforcement and the appropriate University offices.
